Fund objective

The goal of the High Growth Fund is to create long-term wealth for investors by investing in our best investment ideas. The fund aims to deliver industry leading long-term investment growth for our investors, while assuming moderate levels of risk. The historic risk indicators of the High Growth Fund are similar to those of traditional South African balanced funds.

What does the fund invest in?

The fund can invest in a wide range of assets, such as listed shares, bonds and property, as well as cash and cash equivalents, both in South Africa and internationally.

Important fund characteristics and risks


The fund managers look for undervalued securities that offer strong upside potential over the medium to longer term. We conduct rigorous research to understand the companies we invest in and determine their intrinsic value, which allows us to identify the opportunities with the best expected returns. In addition to investing in equities, the fund can also invest in a variety of other assets, such as listed property and bonds. By actively managing the fund's exposure to these different asset classes, we seek to enhance long-term returns while managing the overall level of risk. The fund may experience negative returns in periods of negative market returns, albeit at a lower level than a fund that is only invested in shares. It is unlikely that the fund will lose money over the medium to longer term.

IMPORTANT NOTES ON CALCULATION OF NET RETURNS AND RISK MEASURES:

The calculation of net returns and the risk measures comprises data from the Peregrine High Growth *en Commandiite Partnership* from 1 February 2000 until 30 November 2016, thereafter the data relates to the Peregrine Capital High Growth H4 QI Hedge Fund ("the High Growth Fund").

The High Growth Fund does not have a benchmark and does not contribute towards the return of the ASSISA SA Multi Asset -High Equity category.

The data for the ASSISA-SA Multi Asset - High Equity category and the FTSE/JSE Capped SWIX All Share Index is provided for comparative purposes.

FUND COMMENTARY

Quarterly Performance

The Peregrine Capital High Growth QI Fund delivered a net return of 8.53% for the third quarter of 2024. This compares with the JSE Capped SWIX All Share Index, which gained 9.62%% in the quarter. It is worth noting that the fund's strong performance during the quarter was achieved while assuming significantly less risk than the market.

Attribution

Returns were broad-based in Q3. Exposure to South African bonds and equities was a significant contributor, following the formation of the Government of National Unity (GNU). Companies in the real estate, financial services, industrials, and retail sectors drove the majority of positive performance, while healthcare was the only local sector with negative returns. Our exposure to Chinese technology shares produced solid international returns after Chinese policymakers announced substantial stimulus measures. Additionally, our selective exposure to technology names in the West contributed to returns this quarter, as AI continues to drive demand for products and services of the companies we own in that category.

Macro

The extreme anxiety that engulfed local markets in the first half of the year was replaced by relief and optimism in the third quarter. The formation of a credible Government of National Unity drove bond and equity markets materially higher, as investors factored in the potential for higher growth stemming from the acceleration of market-oriented reforms. Hope springs eternal!

Internationally, the third quarter was dominated by discussions around inflation, interest rates, and Chinese stimulus. While economic data from the West indicated that inflation had moderated, it was accompanied by slowing economic momentum. Central banks in Europe and the USA initiated interest rate cuts during the quarter, signalling the start of an economic easing cycle. Meanwhile, after a prolonged period of sluggish growth in China, the government announced a series of significant monetary interventions, which drove equity prices higher, particularly in the most under-owned sectors of global equities.

Portfolio Construction

We meaningfully reduced our exposure to South African bonds and equities this quarter as markets rallied and prices approached our fair value estimates. While we remain optimistic about the trajectory of the South African economy under the GNU's stewardship, we need to see evidence of higher growth rates to improve forward-looking return estimates from current prices. Despite trimming our South African positions, we retain selective exposure to undervalued mid-caps and high-quality names with strong growth prospects.

The funds were also net sellers of international equities in the quarter. While we continue to believe that Chinese technology shares are undervalued and under-owned, we have reduced some exposure to these names following the recent rally to better manage our position sizes.

At the end of the quarter, net exposure to equities and real estate stood at 63%, while net exposure to bonds was 14% for High Growth QIHF.

Outlook

As global markets have rallied and expected returns have decreased, maintaining a higher exposure to cash feels prudent at this time. While we are not bearish on growth - either at a macro level or for the individual companies within our investment universe—we are less enthusiastic about the prospective returns offered by asset prices in the current market. We remain on the lookout for attractive investment opportunities, and the funds are well-positioned to deploy capital should prices decline, or compelling new ideas emerge.

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: reflects longer term performance rescaled to a 1year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period.

High Water Mark (HWM): The highest point in value that the investor's unit has reached. The HWM mark ensures that Peregrine Capital does not get paid a Performance Fee for the same performance twice. The HWM is updated at each Crystallisation Point.

Maximum drawdown: the largest peak to trough decline during a specific period of investment

Total Expense Ratio: includes the annual service charge, performance fee and administrative costs, but excludes VAT and fund transaction costs, expressed as a percentage of the average monthly value of the fund. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return.

Transaction Costs: are the costs relating to the buying and selling of the fund's underlying assets, expressed as a percentage of the NAV. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in managing the fund and may impact the returns. **Total Investment Charge** is the sum of the TER and TC. These should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of fund and the investment decisions of the fund manager. Since the fund returns are quoted after the deduction of these expenses, the TER and TC should not be deducted again from published returns.

Sources of Leverage:

The prime broker appointed for the fund is Peresec (Pty) Ltd ("Peresec"). The fund achieves its leveraged positions through the utilisation of derivatives and short positions. Refer below for the quarter end leverage value.

Exposure Limits:

Gross exposure is the measure of leverage, with the limit set at 5 times NAV.

Re-hypothecation of assets:

Re-hypothecation refers to the practice whereby the prime broker uses the securities of the fund as collateral for the prime broker's own purposes. The prime broker mandate in place with Peresec does not permit the rehypothecation of assets. The mandate in place with Morgan Stanley & Co. International plc allows for rehypothecation in accordance with the agreed terms. On a daily basis the maximum limit of re-hypothecation allowed is calculated, referred to as the adjusted value, and is reported with the details of any re-hypothecated assets. At quarter end there were no re-hypothecated assets.

Methodology of stress testing:

The methodology for stress testing is based on a regulatory requirement to test the impact on the performance of the fund under outlier events based on historical correlations. H4 uses an external risk data service provider, RisCura Analytics (Pty) Ltd, who has the capabilities to stress test portfolio information through a global risk factor model, MSCI BarraOne. Various stressed environments have been created and their impact assessed on the fund.

H4 are comfortable with the results of the stress testing performed on the fund for the quarter.

Changes to the liquidity profile of the fund:

There were no significant changes to the liquidity profile of the fund.

Investment strategy and mandate

The fund invests across asset classes, both locally and offshore. Significant exposures may be taken in individual positions from time to time. Peregrine Capital employs a bottom up stock selection process based on rigorous and disciplined fundamental research, drawing on experience of covering the sectors and companies over many years. Peregrine Capital focuses its time on building up a detailed understanding of specific companies, rather than predicting the economic trends or taking a view on overall markets.

Risk warning

Calculation of the NAV and price

The value of participatory interests (also referred to as units) is calculated on a net asset value ("NAV") basis. The price of participatory interests is calculated by dividing the NAV by the number of participatory interests in issue for that class. Investment performance

The performance calculated and shown is that of the fund. Performance has been calculated using net NAV to NAV numbers with income reinvested. The investment performance for each period shown reflects the net return for investors who have been fully invested for that period. Individual investor investment performance may differ as a result of initial fees (if applicable), the actual investment date, the date of reinvestment of distributions and/or distribution dates, and dividend withholding tax. Where periods of longer than 1 year are used in calculating past performance, certain figures may be annualised. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures and investment performance calculations are available on request from H4.

Performance fees

A management and performance fee is charged to the fund. Performance fees are payable on positive performance using a participation rate of 20%.

Total Expense Ratio for year ended 31 March 2024 5.59% A high water mark ("HWM") is applied, which ensures that performance fees will only be charged on new performance. There is no cap on the Rand amount of performance fees.

Disclosure in respect of third party named portfolios

The fund is a third party named portfolio. A hosted or third party named portfolio bears the name of the Manager and the fund manager. The Manager retains full legal responsibility for hosted/third party named portfolios.

Fund dealing and redemption notice period

Monthly, with 1 calendar months' notice for redemptions.
